1670	Will of Thomas Thompson of Knock, yeoman	Rob Bellasse and John Bellassa of Keasley owed Bonds of £30
1671	Will of Robert Thornber of Close Houses, yeoman	Robert Bellas received half the goods etc promised at marriage with daughter Kattern, was also a witness and appraised the inventory
1672	Will of Janat Thornber of Close Houses, Knock	Robert Bellas was son in law, witness and appraised the inventory
1687	Will of Agnes Whitelock of Close House, widow	William Bellas of Knock owed her £2 John Bellas of Knock owed her £2 Robt Bellas of Keesley owed her £3
1692	Inventory of Elizabeth Whitelock of Knock, Close House, spinster	Robert Bellas of Keasley owed her £9
